# GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT



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### Preface

It gives me a great pleasure to present the 2022 gross domestic product (GDP) annual estimates. The Central Statistical Office (CSO) publishes the country's gross domestic product (GDP) on quarterly and annual basis. GDP measures the monetary value of all final goods and services produced within the country's borders in a given time period. It measures the size of the economy and its growth rate over time, and is the most familiar and widely recognised feature of the national accounts.

These estimates were compiled following the System of National Accounts (SNA 2008) which is described as a statistical framework that provides comprehensive, consistent and flexible set of macroeconomic accounts for policymaking, analysis and research purposes. The classification of individual economic activities is based on the International Standard of Industrial Classification (ISIC Rev. 4)

Moreover, these estimates were compiled using the Production approach which is a sum of gross value add (GVA) from the production of goods and services at market prices and the Expenditure approach which is a summation of the total expenditure of different sectors of the economy.

I would like to give sincere thanks to our different data sources for their continual provision of the required data. Without them, it would have been impossible to produce these estimates.

### Background

GDP is a measure of the economic activity and corresponds to the value of all goods and services produced less the value of any goods or services used in their production within a country. Nominal GDP is the market value of goods and services at current prices, whilst real GDP estimates are adjusted for inflation to give constant prices relative to a base year. The base year is chosen to give an accurate reflection of the economy at a given time. In the case of Eswatini the base year is 2011. The real GDP growth rate is the level at which real GDP changes from one year to the next. This allows for comparisons of an individual economy over time and between economies of different countries in a given year.

Estimates of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by both Production and Expenditure approaches were compiled according to the concepts and definitions of the System of National Accounts (2008 SNA), which is the internationally agreed standard set of recommendations on how to compile measures of economic activity. Amongst others, the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) Revision 4 was also used to classify the establishments by kind of economic activity.


## Gross Domestic Product 2022

### Key Findings


The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the year 2022 stands at **E78.390 billion**.

The Real GDP grew by **0.5 percent** compared to a growth of 10.7 percent realised in 2021 (Figure 1). The observed growth is mainly contributed by the Primary Sector which grew by 5.2 percent (Figure 2).

**Figure 2: Sector Growth Rates**



### Industry Contributions

Figure 3 below illustrates the proportion of GDP by industry for 2022. Manufacturing contributes the largest share to GDP of 27.9%, followed by Wholesale and retail trade with 15.9%, and Agriculture and forestry, Public administration and defence with 8.6% and 6.8% respectively. The least contributing industries are Mining and Quarrying with 0.3% and Arts entertainment and recreation at 0.1%.

### Revisions of Preliminary 2021

Accurate and consistent data is needed for policy formulation and decision making. Due to these inherent data needs, provisional data may be used pending availability of firm data. In this regard, revision of data becomes inevitable. However, the revision should be done systematically and in a transparent manner.

National accounts are revised due to revisions to source data, availability of new data and introduction of new methodology. The main objectives of these

revisions is to ensure transparency in the revised data and to maintain the quality and integrity of the data.

The 2021 preliminary GDP estimates has been revised upwards by 2.8%. The main contributors of these revisions were both the primary sector, secondary and the tertiary sector which were revised up by 2.1%, 2.5% and 2.7% respectively. These revisions were due to changes observed in source data.

## Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Expenditure Approach

By definition, the expenditure approach to GDP is measured by the sum of private consumption expenditure (household final consumption expenditure and non-profit institutions serving households), general government final consumption expenditure, gross capital formation, and net exports of goods and services.

This approach indicated a decline in consumption expenditure both by private and government by -5.3% and -0.3% respectively in the year 2022. There was also a negative growth in gross fixed capital formation of -10.8% and -14.6% in net exports of goods and services. The negative net exports have contributed to a higher statistical discrepancy, and by definition, it means the difference in methodology between the two approaches of compiling GDP (production and expenditure approaches), refer to table 5-8.
